For our special education advocates, admission, transition, and independent education consulting professionals, and educational, clinical, and therapeutic professionals, this conference is designed to create opportunities for professional development. The conference offers a content-rich selection of presentations and will include opportunities to draw upon the knowledge gained to develop strategies for applying that knowledge in the home, in the classroom, and in clinical and therapeutic practices.
